640 new specialist accommodation places for people with a disability in NSW

(Ministerial Press Release – NSW Minister for Disability Services Paul Lynch)

The NSW Government will spend \$68 million over the next four years to provide more than 640 specialist accommodation and support places for people with a disability.

Minister for Disability Services Paul Lynch said the range of accommodation options would also be expanded, giving clients the ability to choose services that better match their support needs. "At least 75 percent of models currently under construction are models of housing that go beyond the traditional group home," Mr Lynch said.

Mr Lynch said a panel of service providers would cut red tape to deliver better ways of delivering accommodation support options for people with a disability, their families and carers. "The new system will simplify procurement practices and reduce costs and paperwork," he said.

Organisations involved will benefit from a streamlined funding process and increased tendering opportunities and will have ongoing business relationships with Ageing, Disability and Home Care (ADHC) in the development and delivery of new and innovative accommodation support services. Mr Lynch said that the establishment of the panel would allow the Government to purchase more than 640 specialist accommodation places.

National Disability Services (NDS) State Manager Patrick Maher said providers were looking forward to less red tape and more productive relationships with government. "The panel and related procurement processes will provide opportunities to build and consolidate the disability accommodation support sector," Mr Maher said. "The opportunity to work more collaboratively with Ageing Disability and Home Care on service planning and proposals will result in improved outcomes to clients and their families," he said.

The release of a report commissioned by the Victorian Government into the adequacy of government funding for out of home disability services has identified a clear case for an increase in government funding of at \$22 million for supported accommodation and day services.

The *Price Review Out of Home Disability Services Report* also concluded that funding should be increased for respite services; and that further work is needed to identify the costs of therapy, transport and other disability services. Longer lifespans means in 20 years there will be nearly twice as many people suffering from dementia in the world as there are today, experts have warned. In 2010 there will be 35.6 million people across the world with dementia and Alzheimer's disease, which will almost double to 65.7 million in 2030, according to British researchers. They estimated that the number would nearly double again 20 years later, to 115.4 million in 2050.

New free law case citatory

High Court judge Justice Michael Kirby has launched Australia's first internet-based system offering free access to citations of Australian law.

Law Cite includes citations of Australian law and those of other countries whose case data is available through the Free Access to Law Movement. It includes numerous citations of Australian cases by overseas courts. The database was developed by the Australasian Legal Information Institute (AustLII), a joint initiative of the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS), and the University of New South Wales. Launching LawCite at AustLII, Justice Kirby said free public access to the law and legal materials was crucial. "With this development, AustLII has made law so accessible that it is now at the fingertips of every Australian who can access the internet," he said.
